(MOSCAR CROSS ROAD)
(PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) ORDER 2024

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on the 25th day of January 2024 the Sheffield City Council made the above Order which comes into operation on the 29th day of January 2024 under the provisions of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Order will be to introduce:

- Prohibition of Driving from the 1st October to 31st May each year on Moscar Cross Road (except for solo motorcycles);

A copy of the Order may be examined during normal opening hours at First Point Reception, Howden House, 1 Union Street, Sheffield, S1 2SH or within the **Sealed Traffic Orders** section on the Council website at <https://www.sheffield.gov.uk/home/roads-pavements/traffic-orders>

Any person who wishes to question the validity of the Order or any of its provisions on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the enabling Act or that a requirement of the enabling Act or any of the relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with may, within six weeks of the 25th January 2024 make application for that purpose to the High Court.

(MOSCAR CROSS ROAD)
(PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) ORDER 2024

The Sheffield City Council in exercise of its powers under Section 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 4 (2), 32(1), 35(1), 45, 46, 46A, 49, 51, 53 and 124 (1) (c) (d) and (f) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (c.27) (“the Act”) and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on the 29th day of January 2024 and may be cited as The Sheffield City Council (Moscar Cross Road) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 2024.
2. Save as provided in Article 3, 4 and 5 of this order no person shall cause or permit any motor vehicle to proceed over the roads specified in Column 1 of Schedule 1 to the extent described in Column 2 of Schedule 1 between the 1st day of October and the 31st day of May each year.

Exemptions

3. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall apply to a vehicle which is:-
 - a) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes in an emergency; or
 - b) proceeding upon the direction of or with the permission of a police officer in uniform.
4. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall apply to a solo motor cycle.
5. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful for any vehicle to proceed in that length of road referred to in Schedule 1 of this Order, if the vehicle is requiring access to premises or land situated on or adjacent to the said length of road
6. Being used, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, in the service of a local authority or of a statutory undertaker in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
7. For so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely –
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said road; and
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said road of any sewer or of any main, pipe, line or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any line which is or forms part of electronic communications apparatus as defined in the Communications Act 2003;
