Diocese of Sheffield, faculties from 1914 onwards (these detail changes made to Anglican church buildings) *(Sheffield Archives: DIOC/FAC)*

Beighton was in the Diocese of Lichfield until 1884, when it became part of the newly-established Diocese of Southwell. The parish was subsequently transferred to the Diocese of Derby on its formation in 1927, and, at the time of the creation of the county of South Yorkshire in 1974, Beighton was transferred to the Diocese of Sheffield. Archives are located as follows:

Diocese of Lichfield (prior to 1884) contact <u>Lichfield Record Office</u>. Diocese of Southwell (1884 - 1927) contact <u>Nottinghamshire Archives</u>. Diocese of Derby (1927 - 1974) contact <u>Derbyshire Record Office</u>. Diocese of Sheffield records are at Sheffield Archives.

Clubs, Societies and Charities

A search of the online catalogues and the card indexes at Archives and Local Studies may reveal records from Beighton based clubs, societies and charities; for instance:

Courts

The Magistrates Court (or Petty Sessions court) records deal mainly with minor offences and licensing the sale and consumption of liquor. Records of the Sheffield Division cover the borough and City of Sheffield and records of Upper Strafforth and Tickhill Division of the West Riding of Yorkshire cover areas outside the borough such as Handsworth, Ecclesfield and Bradfield, c. 1870 - 1976. *(Sheffield Archives: MC)*

There are also records of the Court of Quarter Sessions from 1880. *(Sheffield Archives: QS)*

For records of Derbyshire courts (parts of Beighton were in Derbyshire until 1967) contact <u>Derbyshire Record Office</u>.

Electoral Registers and Poll Books

Sometimes known as Burgess Rolls or voters' lists, in essence, electoral rolls are lists of people that are entitled to vote. The Sheffield Local Studies Library has a comprehensive collection from 1841 onwards. Hospitals

Sheffield Archives has records from over 50 hospitals, including annual reports, photographs and administrative records.

As Beighton was in Derbyshire until 1967 older records will be at <u>Derbyshire Record</u> <u>Office</u>.

Land, Building and Property Records

The Local Studies Library has a collection of sale particulars (often with plans) dating from the late 18th century; for instance, there is a catalogue for the sale of Drake House Estate, 1909 (*Sheffield Local Studies Library: PLC BEIG4*). In addition there are a few planning applications from Chesterfield Rural District Council (which included Beighton (*Sheffield Archives: CA516 and CA519*), as well as Sheffield City Council (*Sheffield Archives: CA206*), etc. There may also be planning applications at <u>Derbyshire Record Office</u>.

There are also deeds to properties and records of land valuations which detail owners and occupiers at Sheffield Archives.

A search of the Archives and Local Studies online catalogues and the card indexes may reveal relevant entries. *(Sheffield Archives and Sheffield Local Studies Library)*

As Beighton was in Derbyshire until 1967 some land, building and property records may be at <u>Derbyshire Record Office</u>.

Maps

There are large-scale maps of the Sheffield area from 1853 to the present day. Comprehensive coverage of Sheffield and partial coverage of the surrounding areas is available at Sheffield Local Studies Library. Sheffield Archives has incomplete historic coverage of most of South Yorkshire. The two main Sheffield newspapers are the *Sheffield Morning Telegraph* (later *Sheffield Telegraph*) and *The Star*, and these are available on microfilm at Sheffield Local Studies Library.

As Beighton was in Derbyshire County and Chesterfield Rural District until 1967 records of the poor law and local government will be available in <u>Derbyshire Record</u> <u>Office</u>.

Schools

Sheffield Archives has records from over 200 schools, including admission registers and head teachers' log books (diaries). For instance log books of Beighton Secondary School from 1880 (*CA35*). As Beighton was in Derbyshire until 1933 some school records may be at <u>Derbyshire</u> <u>Record Office</u>.

Other libraries and archives

In addition to information held at Sheffield Archives and Local Studies other library and archive services will also hold relevant material:

Prior to 1967, Beighton was in Derbyshire. For records of Derbyshire contact <u>Derbyshire Record Office</u> and <u>Derbyshire Local Studies Library</u>. Beighton was in the Diocese of Lichfield until 1884, when it became part of the newly-established Diocese of Southwell. The parish was subsequently transferred to the Diocese of Derby on its formation in 1927, and, at the time of the creation of the county of South Yorkshire in 1974, Beighton was transferred to the Diocese of Sheffield. Archives are located as follows:

Diocese of Lichfield (prior to 1884) contact <u>Lichfield Record Office</u>. Diocese of Southwell (1884 - 1927) contact <u>Nottinghamshire Archives</u>. Diocese of Derby (1927 - 1974) contact <u>Derbyshire Record Office</u>. Diocese of Sheffield records are at Sheffield Archives.

Wills and probate records relating to those who died in Beighton prior to 1858 are held within the Lichfield Diocesan archives at the <u>Lichfield Record Office</u>. Probate records after 1858 are held at <u>The National Archives</u> (TNA). There are transcripts of wills of Beighton residents, 1533 - 1750 at Sheffield Archives (MD7730).

Court records will be held at the <u>Derbyshire Record Office</u> and at the <u>National</u> <u>Archives</u>.

<u>The National Archives</u> (TNA) holds records of central government departments and agencies. You can search the <u>TNA catalogue</u> online.

Information on archaeological sites and ancient monuments is held by the <u>South</u> <u>Yorkshire Archaeology Service's Sites and Monuments Record</u>.
