#### Clubs, Societies and Charities

#### Courts

The Magistrates Court (or Petty Sessions court) records deal mainly with minor offences and licensing the sale and consumption of liquor. Records of the Sheffield Division cover the borough and City of Sheffield and records of Upper Strafforth and Tickhill Division of the West Riding of Yorkshire cover areas outside the borough such as Handsworth, Ecclesfield and Bradfield, c. 1870 - 1976. (Sheffield Archives: MC)

There are also records of the Court of Quarter Sessions from 1880. (Sheffield Archives: QS)

#### **Electoral Registers and Poll Books**

Sometimes known as Burgess Rolls or voters' lists, in essence, electoral rolls are lists of people that are entitled to vote. The Sheffield Local Studies Library has a comprehensive collection from 1841 onwards. #### Land, Building and Property Records

The Local Studies Library has a collection of sale particulars (often with plans) dating from the late 18<sup>th</sup> century; for instance, there is a catalogue for the sale of a freehold substantially built family residence with entrance lodge, gardens, pleasure grounds, tennis courts, conservatories, stabling and outbuildings called Bents Green Lodge ... 29 June 1905 (*Sheffield Local Studies Library: Sale Plans*). In addition there are planning applications (*Sheffield Archives: CA206*), etc.

There are also deeds to properties and records of land valuations which detail owners and occupiers at Sheffield Archives.

A search of the Archives and Local Studies online catalogues and the card indexes may reveal relevant entries.

#### Maps

There are large-scale maps of the Sheffield area from 1853 to the present day. Comprehensive coverage of Sheffield and partial coverage of the surrounding areas is available at Sheffield Local Studies Library. #### Poor Law, Civil Parish and Local Government records

Ecclesall Bierlow Poor Law Union was formed in 1837. It comprised the townships of Ecclesall Bierlow, Upper and Nether Hallam, Dore, Totley, the parish of Norton, and Beauchief Liberty. A workhouse was built 1842 -1843 at Cherrytree Hill (later known as Nether Edge Hospital) to replace an old workhouse in Psalter Lane. In c. 1925 Ecclesall Bierlow Union and Sheffield Union were dissolved and the new Sheffield Union was created.

#### **Schools**

There are records from over 200 schools, including admission registers and head teachers' log books (diaries). For instance log books / photographs / minutes, etc. of Broad Elms Special School (Sheffield Archives: acc. 2005/83) and brochure for the opening of Bents Green Open Air School, 1930 (Local Studies: local pamphlets vol. 128 no. 2 (042S)). #### Other libraries and archives

For areas formerly in the West Riding of Yorkshire there may be relevant records at the <u>West Yorkshire Archives Service</u>.

Prior to 1914, Bents Green came within the jurisdiction of the Diocese of York. There are extensive archives of the Diocese at the <u>Borthwick Institute for Archives</u> in York.

Wills and probate records relating to those who died in Bents Green prior to 1858 are held at the <u>Borthwick Institute for Archives</u> in York. Probate records after 1858 are held at <u>The National Archives</u> (TNA).

Court records will also be held at the <u>West Yorkshire Archive Service</u> and at the National Archives.

<u>The National Archives</u> (TNA) holds records of central government departments and agencies. You can search the <u>TNA catalogue</u> online.

Information on archaeological sites and ancient monuments is held by the <u>South</u> <u>Yorkshire Archaeology Service's Sites and Monuments Record.</u>
