This guide gives a brief introduction to the variety of sources available for researching the history of Bolsterstone at Sheffield Archives and Local Studies Library.

Bolsterstone, 10 miles North West of Sheffield, was in the Ecclesfield parish and the Diocese of York. For local government purposes it was in the West Riding of Yorkshire and Stocksbridge Urban District until 1974 when it was transferred to the city of Sheffield.

Census returns

These list every resident by household and include names, relationships, occupations, ages and birth places, every 10 years from 1841 through to 1911, available free at every Sheffield library and at Sheffield Archives via www.Ancestry.com

Church registers and records, monumental (gravestone) inscriptions and cemeteries

The ancient chapel of Bolsterstone a chapel-of-ease to St Nicholas' church, Bradfield until 1870, when Bolsterstone became a separate parish.

Courts

The Magistrates Court (or Petty Sessions court) records deal mainly with minor offences and licensing the sale and consumption of liquor. Records of the Sheffield Division cover the borough and City of Sheffield and records of Upper Strafforth and Tickhill Division of West Riding of Yorkshire cover areas outside the borough such as Handsworth, Ecclesfield and Bradfield.

There are also records of the Court of Quarter Sessions from 1880. (Sheffield Archives: QS)

Electoral Registers and Poll Books

Sometimes known as Burgess Rolls or voters' lists, in essence, electoral rolls are lists of people that are entitled to vote. The Sheffield Local Studies Library has a comprehensive collection from 1841 onwards. For West Riding electoral registers and poll books courts (Bolsterstone was in the West Riding of Yorkshire until 1974) contact West Yorkshire Archives.

Hospitals

Sheffield Archives has records from over 50 hospitals, including annual reports, photographs and administrative records.

As Bolsterstone was in the West Riding of Yorkshire until 1974 older records will be at West Yorkshire Archives.

Land, Building and Property Records

The Local Studies Library has a collection of sale particulars (often with plans) dating from the late 18th century; for instance, there is a catalogue for the sale of Waldershaigh, Bolsterstone in 1970 (*Sheffield Local Studies Library: Sale Plans*). In addition there are planning applications for Sheffield city (*Sheffield Archives: CA206*) and Stocksbridge Urban District Council (*Sheffield Archives: CA759 and CA773*) etc.

There are also deeds to properties and records of land valuations which detail owners and occupiers at Sheffield Archives.

A search of the Archives and Local Studies online catalogues and the card indexes may reveal relevant entries.

As Bolsterstone was in the West Riding of Yorkshire until 1974 some land, building and property records may be at <u>West Yorkshire Archives</u>.

Maps

There are large-scale maps of the Sheffield area from 1853 to the present day. Comprehensive coverage of Sheffield and partial coverage of the surrounding areas is available at Sheffield Local Studies Library. Sheffield Archives has incomplete historic coverage of most of South Yorkshire. The two main Sheffield newspapers are the *Sheffield Morning Telegraph* (later *Sheffield Telegraph*) and *The Star*, and these are available on microfilm at Sheffield Local Studies Library.

Poor Law, Civil Parish and Local Government records

Ecclesfield and Bolsterstone were in the Wortley Poor Law Union established in 1838.

Schools

Sheffield Archives and Local Studies has records from over 200 schools, including admission registers and head teachers' log books (diaries). For instance log books and admission registers for Bolsterstone Junior and Infant school from c. 1852

As Bolsterstone was in the West Riding of Yorkshire until 1974 some school records may be at West Yorkshire Archives.

For areas formerly in the West Riding of Yorkshire there may be relevant records at the West Yorkshire Archives Service.

Prior to 1914, Bolsterstone came within the jurisdiction of the Diocese of York.

There are extensive archives of the Diocese at the Borthwick Institute for Archives in York.

Wills and probate records relating to those who died in Bolsterstone prior to 1858 are held at the <u>Borthwick Institute for Archives</u> in York. Probate records after 1858 are held at <u>The National Archives</u> (TNA).

Court records will also be held at the <u>West Yorkshire Archive Service</u> and at the National Archives.

<u>The National Archives</u> (TNA) holds records of central government departments and agencies. You can search the <u>TNA catalogue</u> online.

Information on archaeological sites and ancient monuments is held by the <u>South</u> Yorkshire Archaeology Service's Sites and Monuments Record.
