This guide gives a brief introduction to the variety of sources available for researching the history of Bradfield at Sheffield Archives and Local Studies Library.

Bradfield, 11 miles North West of Sheffield, was an ancient parish in the Diocese of York. For local government purposes it was in the West Riding of Yorkshire and Wortley Rural District until 1974 when it was transferred to the city of Sheffield. (though some parts of Bradfield had been incorporated into Sheffield in 1900).

#### Courts

The Magistrates Court (or Petty Sessions court) records deal mainly with minor offences and licensing the sale and consumption of liquor. Records of the Sheffield Division cover the borough and City of Sheffield and records of Upper Strafforth and Tickhill Division of West Riding of Yorkshire cover areas outside the borough such as Handsworth, Ecclesfield and Bradfield. *(Sheffield Archives: MC)* 

There are also records of the Court of Quarter Sessions from 1880. *(Sheffield Archives: QS)*

#### **Electoral Registers and Poll Books**

Sometimes known as Burgess Rolls or voters' lists, in essence, electoral rolls are lists of people that are entitled to vote. The Sheffield Local Studies Library has a comprehensive collection from 1841 onwards. #### Land, Building and Property Records

The Local Studies Library has a collection of sale particulars (often with plans) dating from the late 18<sup>th</sup> century; for instance, there is a catalogue for the sale of a farm land and homestead at Holdworth in the parish of Bradfield, 1898 (*Sheffield Local Studies Library: Sale Plans*). In addition there are planning applications for Sheffield city (*Sheffield Archives: CA206*) and Wortley Rural District Council registers of building plans, 1881 - 1936 (*Sheffield Archives: CA676*); etc. There are also deeds to properties and records of land valuations which detail owners and occupiers at Sheffield Archives.

A search of the Archives and Local Studies online catalogues and the card indexes may reveal relevant entries.

As Bradfield was in the West Riding of Yorkshire until 1974 some land, building and property records may be at <u>West Yorkshire Archives</u>.

#### Maps

There are large-scale maps of the Sheffield area from 1853 to the present day. Comprehensive coverage of Sheffield and partial coverage of the surrounding areas is available at Sheffield Local Studies Library. Sheffield Archives has incomplete historic coverage of most of South Yorkshire. Bradfield was in the Wortley Poor Law Union established in 1838.

Sheffield Archives and Local Studies has records from over 200 schools, including admission registers and head teachers' log books (diaries). Prior to 1914, Bradfield came within the jurisdiction of the Diocese of York. There are extensive archives of the Diocese at the <u>Borthwick Institute for Archives</u> in York.

Wills and probate records relating to those who died in Bradfield prior to 1858 are held at the <u>Borthwick Institute for Archives</u> in York.

Court records will also be held at the <u>West Yorkshire Archive Service</u> and at the <u>National Archives</u>.

<u>The National Archives</u> (TNA) holds records of central government departments and agencies. You can search the <u>TNA catalogue</u> online.
