This guide gives a brief introduction to the sources available for researching the history of Deepcar at Sheffield Archives and Local Studies Library.

Deepcar is a village located to the east of Stocksbridge, in the Stocksbridge and Upper Don Ward, approximately 8 miles north west of Sheffield city centre. Deepcar was in the Ecclesfield parish and the Diocese of York. For local government purposes it was in the West Riding of Yorkshire and Stocksbridge Urban District until 1974 when it was transferred to the city of Sheffield.

Clubs, Societies and Charities

A search of the online catalogues and the card indexes at Archives and Local Studies may reveal records from Deepcar based clubs, societies and charities; for instance:

Eric Longford Jessop, *Barnsley brass: echoes of Barnsley and district brass bands*, 2006 - includes information on Deepcar Brass Band *(Sheffield Local Studies Library: 784.9)*

Courts

The Magistrates Court (or Petty Sessions court) records deal mainly with minor offences and licensing the sale and consumption of liquor. Records of the Sheffield Division cover the borough and City of Sheffield and records of Upper Strafforth and Tickhill Division of West Riding of Yorkshire cover areas outside the borough such as Handsworth, Ecclesfield and Bradfield. *(Sheffield Archives: MC)*

There are also records of the Court of Quarter Sessions from 1880. *(Sheffield Archives: QS)*

For records of West Riding of Yorkshire courts (Deepcar was in the West Riding until 1974) contact <u>West Yorkshire Archives</u>.

Electoral Registers and Poll Books

Sometimes known as Burgess Rolls or voters' lists, in essence, electoral rolls are lists of people that are entitled to vote. The Sheffield Local Studies Library has a comprehensive collection from 1841 onwards. For West Riding electoral registers and poll books courts (Deepcar was in the West Riding of Yorkshire until 1974) contact <u>West Yorkshire Archives</u>.

Hospitals

Sheffield Archives has records from over 50 hospitals, including annual reports, photographs and administrative records.

As Deepcar was in the West Riding of Yorkshire until 1974, older records will be at <u>West Yorkshire Archives</u>.

Land, Building and Property Records

The Local Studies Library has a collection of sale particulars (often with plans) dating from the late 18th century; for instance, there are plans, particulars and conditions of sale of 'valuable licenced public-house and sales shops at Stocksbridge and freehold building land at Deepcar', 1902 (*Sheffield Local Studies Library*)

In addition some planning applications survive from the late 19th century onwards – these include Stocksbridge Urban District Council (UDC), 1876 - 1974 (*Sheffield Archives: CA759*), Stocksbridge UDC register of plans (*Sheffield Archives: CA773*) and from 1974 onwards for Deepcar, Sheffield City Council (*Sheffield Archives: CA206*). For example, Waterworks office, Deepcar, 1897 (*Sheffield Archives: CA759/17*); 8 flats at Truman Grove, Deepcar, 1974 (*Sheffield Archives: CA206/1974/3242B*).

There are also deeds to properties and records of land valuations which detail owners and occupiers at Sheffield Archives. A search of the Archives and Local Studies online catalogues and the card indexes may reveal relevant entries. *(Sheffield Archives and Sheffield Local Studies Library)*

Maps

There are large-scale maps of the Sheffield area from 1853 to the present day. Comprehensive coverage of Sheffield and partial coverage of the surrounding areas is available at Sheffield Local Studies Library. Sheffield Archives has incomplete historic coverage of most of South Yorkshire. Newspapers

The two main Sheffield newspapers are the *Sheffield Morning Telegraph* (later *Sheffield Telegraph*) and *The Star*, and these are available on microfilm at Sheffield Local Studies Library.

The Sheffield Independent, 1819 - 1900; Sheffield Daily Telegraph 1855 - 1903 and Sheffield Evening Telegraph, 1887 - 1897 are available online at www.britishnewspaperarchive.co.uk/.

In addition, the *Penistone, Stocksbridge and Hoyland Express* (later *South Yorkshire Times*) covering Deepcar is available on microfilm from 1898 (*Sheffield Local Studies Library*).

Deepcar was formerly in the Wortley Poor Law Union formed in 1838.

Schools

Sheffield Archives and Local Studies has records from over 200 schools, including admission registers and head teachers' log books (diaries). For instance Governors' Minutes from Royd Nursery Infant School, Carr Road, Deepcar, 1977 – 1990 (Sheffield Archives: CA724/P119/1-3). Other libraries and archives

In addition to information held at Sheffield Archives and Local Studies other library and archive services will also hold relevant material:

Stocksbridge Library has photographs, books and maps relating to Deepcar.

Bradfield, in the ancient parish of Ecclesfield, covered a very large area including Deepcar. Some records may be held at <u>Bradfield Archives</u>.

For areas formerly in the West Riding of Yorkshire (Deepcar was in the West Riding until 1974) there may be relevant records at the <u>West Yorkshire Archives Service</u>.

Prior to 1914, Deepcar came within the jurisdiction of the Diocese of York. There are extensive archives of the Diocese at the <u>Borthwick Institute for Archives</u> in York.

Wills and probate records relating to those who died in Deepcar prior to 1858 are held at the <u>Borthwick Institute for Archives</u> in York. Probate records after 1858 are held at <u>The National Archives</u> (TNA).

Court records will also be held at the <u>West Yorkshire Archive Service</u> and at the <u>National Archives</u>.

<u>The National Archives</u> (TNA) holds records of central government departments and agencies. You can search the <u>TNA catalogue</u> online.

Information on archaeological sites and ancient monuments is held by the <u>South</u> <u>Yorkshire Archaeology Service's Sites and Monuments Record</u>. Stocksbridge and District History Society http://www.stocksbridgehs.co.uk/society/
