This guide gives a brief introduction to the sources available for researching the history of **Ecclesfield** at Sheffield Archives and Local Studies Library.

Ecclesfield is 7 miles north of Sheffield city centre.

Up until 1974 Ecclesfield was in the West Riding of Yorkshire (though some parts had been absorbed into Sheffield as early as 1901).

Census returns

These list every resident by household and include names, relationships, occupations, ages and birth places, every 10 years from 1841 through to 1911, available free at every Sheffield library and at Sheffield Archives via www.Ancestry.com

Church registers and records, monumental (gravestone) inscriptions and cemeteries

St Mary, Ecclesfield is an ancient parish in the Diocese of York until 1914 (and then in the Diocese of Sheffield). St Paul, Ecclesfield was created in 1949 as mission church to St Mary's.

Courts

The Magistrates Court (or Petty Sessions court) records deal mainly with minor offences and licensing the sale and consumption of liquor. Records of the Sheffield Division cover the borough and City of Sheffield and records of Upper Strafforth and Tickhill Division of West Riding of Yorkshire cover areas outside the borough such as Handsworth, Ecclesfield and Bradfield, c.1870 - 1976.

Electoral Registers and Poll Books

Sometimes known as Burgess Rolls or voters' lists, in essence, electoral rolls are lists of people that are entitled to vote. The Sheffield Local Studies Library has a comprehensive collection from 1841 onwards. More details are available:

Families

There is an extensive archive of books, correspondence and other papers of the Gatty family of Ecclesfield. The Gatty family (including Margaret, writer on natural history and children's writer and Alfred Gatty, vicar of Ecclesfield) were a well known local family.

Land, Building and Property Records

Sale particulars (often with plans) date from the late 18th century; for instance, plan and particulars of freehold land and foundry situate at Charlton Brook in the parish of Ecclesfield, 9 Aug 1887 (*Sheffield Local Studies Library*).

In addition some planning applications survive from the late 19th century onwards – these include Sheffield City (Sheffield Archives: CA206) and Wortley Rural District Council registers of buildings plans, 1881 - 1936 (Sheffield Archives: CA676; CA529).

There are also deeds to properties and records of land valuations which detail owners and occupiers (Sheffield Archives)

Maps

There are large-scale maps of the Sheffield area from 1853 to the present day. Comprehensive coverage of Sheffield and partial coverage of the surrounding areas is available at Sheffield Local Studies Library. Sheffield Archives has incomplete historic coverage of most of South Yorkshire. Prior to 1914, Ecclesfield came within the jurisdiction of the Diocese of York. There are extensive archives of the Diocese at the Borthwick Institute for Archives in York.

Wills and probate records relating to those who died in Ecclesfield prior to 1858 are held at the <u>Borthwick Institute for Archives</u> in York. Probate records after 1858 are held at <u>The National Archives</u> (TNA).

Court records will also be held at the <u>West Yorkshire Archive Service</u> and at the <u>National Archives</u>.

<u>The National Archives</u> (TNA) holds records of central government departments and agencies. You can search the <u>TNA catalogue</u> online.

Information on archaeological sites and ancient monuments is held by the <u>South Yorkshire Archaeology Service's Sites and Monuments Record</u>.
