Greystones lies 2.5 miles south west of Sheffield City Centre. It was formerly a hamlet in the Ecclesall Bierlow township in the parish of Sheffield.

Census returns

These list every resident by household and include names, relationships, occupations, ages and birth places, every 10 years from 1841 through to 1911, available free at every Sheffield library and at Sheffield Archives via <u>www.Ancestry.com</u>

Church registers and records, monumental (gravestone) inscriptions and cemeteries

The parish of St Gabriel, Greystones was formed in the 1930s. Prior to this Greystones was within the parish of All Saints, Ecclesall.

Clubs, Societies and Charities

A search of the online catalogues and the card indexes at Archives and Local Studies may reveal records from Greystones based clubs, societies and charities; for instance:

Courts

The Magistrates Court (or Petty Sessions court) records deal mainly with minor offences and licensing the sale and consumption of liquor. Records of the Sheffield Division cover the borough and City of Sheffield and records of Upper Strafforth and Tickhill Division of West Riding of Yorkshire cover areas outside the borough *(Sheffield Archives: MC)*

There are also records of the Court of Quarter Sessions from 1880. *(Sheffield Archives: QS)*

Electoral Registers and Poll Books

Sometimes known as Burgess Rolls or voters' lists, in essence, electoral rolls are lists of people that are entitled to vote. The Sheffield Local Studies Library has a comprehensive collection from 1841 onwards. Hospitals

Land, Building and Property Records

Sale particulars (often with plans) date from the late 18th century; for instance, particulars of sale of land and minerals at Greystones, 26 Aug 1884 (*Sheffield Local Studies Library*).

In addition some planning applications survive from the late 19th century onwards. *(Sheffield Archives: CA206)*

There are also deeds to properties and records of land valuations which detail owners and occupiers. A search of the Archives and Local Studies online catalogues and the card indexes will reveal other relevant entries. (Sheffield Archives and Sheffield Local Studies Library)

Maps

There are large-scale maps of the Sheffield area from 1853 to the present day. Comprehensive coverage of Sheffield and partial coverage of the surrounding areas is available at Sheffield Local Studies Library. Sheffield Archives has incomplete historic coverage of most of South Yorkshire. Newspapers

The two main Sheffield newspapers are the *Sheffield Morning Telegraph* (later *Sheffield Telegraph*) and *The Star*, and these are available on microfilm at Sheffield Local Studies Library.

Poor Law, Civil Parish and Local Government records

Ecclesall Bierlow Poor Law Union (established in 1837) included Ecclesall Bierlow, Nether Hallam and Upper Hallam. The workhouse was built in 1842-1843 and later became the site of Nether Edge Hospital.

Other libraries and archives

In addition to information held at Sheffield Archives and Local Studies other library and archive services will also hold relevant material: For areas formerly in the West Riding of Yorkshire there may be relevant records at the <u>West Yorkshire Archives Service</u>.

Prior to 1914, Greystones came within the jurisdiction of the Diocese of York. There are extensive archives of the Diocese at the <u>Borthwick Institute for Archives</u> in York.

Wills and probate records relating to those who died in Greystones prior to 1858 are held at the <u>Borthwick Institute for Archives</u> in York. Probate records after 1858 are held at <u>The National Archives</u> (TNA).

Court records will also be held at the <u>West Yorkshire Archive Service</u> and at the <u>National Archives</u>.

<u>The National Archives</u> (TNA) holds records of central government departments and agencies. You can search the <u>TNA catalogue</u> online.

Information on archaeological sites and ancient monuments is held by the <u>South</u> <u>Yorkshire Archaeology Service's Sites and Monuments Record</u>.
