This guide gives a brief introduction to the variety of sources available for researching the history of the area around Kelham Island at Sheffield Archives and Local Studies Library.

Kelham Island lays 2 miles north of Sheffield City Centre. Historically it has been within the township and parish of Sheffield and in the West Riding of Yorkshire.

Courts

The Magistrates Court (or Petty Sessions court) records deal mainly with minor offences and licensing the sale and consumption of liquor. Records of the Sheffield Division cover the borough and City of Sheffield and records of Upper Strafforth and Tickhill Division of West Riding of Yorkshire cover areas outside the borough such as Handsworth, Ecclesfield and Bradfield, c. 1870 - 1976. (Sheffield City Archives: MC)

There are also records of the Court of Quarter Sessions from 1880. (Sheffield City Archives: QS)

Prior to 1880 Kelham Island came within the jurisdiction of the West Riding Quarter Sessions. Records are held at West Yorkshire Archives: www.archives.wyjs.org.uk

Electoral Registers and Poll Books

Sometimes known as Burgess Rolls or voters' lists, in essence, electoral rolls are lists of people that are entitled to vote. The Sheffield Local Studies Library has a comprehensive collection from 1841 onwards. Land, Building and Property Records

Sale particulars (often with plans) date from the late 18th century; for instance, particulars, plan and conditions of sale of valuable freehold works on Kelham Island, Alma Street, Sheffield, 1914 (*Sheffield Local Studies Library: 28 July 1914*). In addition, some planning applications survive from the late 19th century onwards (*Sheffield Archives: CA206*). There are also deeds to properties and records of land valuations which detail owners and occupiers.

Maps

Sheffield's first workhouse was established at West Bar in 1628. A new workhouse on Kelham Street, opened in 1829, was adopted by the Sheffield Poor Law Union until 1881 when a larger institution opened at Fir Vale (later the site of the Northern General Hospital).

Sheffield Poor Law Union (established in 1837 and comprising Attercliffe-cum-Darnall, Brightside Bierlow and Sheffield townships): records include Guardians' minutes 1890-1930 and letter books 1847-1861; officers' appointments 1876-1913; workhouse punishment book 1903-1926, dietary table 1919 (Sheffield City Archives CA 692/1-35, CA24, CA 510); Copy minutes 1891/2 - 1929/30; Statement of Accounts, 1884-1930 (with gaps); Guardian handbook and list of committees, 1894-1904, 1906-1929 (Local Studies Library 352.9 S and 352.9 SQ)
