This guide gives a brief introduction to the variety of sources available for researching the history of Midhopestones at Sheffield City Archives and Local Studies Library.

Midhopestones, 11 miles north-west of Sheffield City Centre, was formerly a township of Bradfield in the parish of Ecclesfield. For local government purposes it was in the West Riding of Yorkshire and Stocksbridge Urban District until 1974 when it was transferred to the city of Sheffield.

## Church registers and records, monumental (gravestone) inscriptions and cemeteries

St James, Midhope, parish records, from 1772 (Sheffield City Archives: PR53)

Between c. 1665 and 1847 the livings of the ancient chapelries of Midhope and Bolsterstone (the latter a chapel-of-ease to St Nicholas, Bradfield) were normally held together, and Midhope entries were included in Bolsterstone St Mary registers until 1813, when separate registers were begun.

Midhope St. James was transferred from the Diocese of York to Wakefield Diocese in 1914. Baptism and burial registers from 1813 onwards are held at the West Yorkshire Archive Service, Wakefield. For marriages at Midhope before 1926 see Bradfield and Penistone registers, and after 1926 see the Midhope registers available at West Yorkshire Archive Service, Wakefield.

#### Courts

The Magistrates Court (or Petty Sessions court) records deal mainly with minor offences and licensing the sale and consumption of liquor. Records of the Sheffield Division cover the borough and City of Sheffield and records of Upper Strafforth and Tickhill Division of West Riding of Yorkshire cover areas outside the borough such as Handsworth, Ecclesfield and Bradfield. *(Sheffield City Archives: MC)* 

There are also records of the Court of Quarter Sessions from 1880. *(Sheffield City Archives: QS)*

#### **Electoral Registers and Poll Books**

Sometimes known as Burgess Rolls or voters' lists, in essence, electoral rolls are lists of people that are entitled to vote. The Sheffield Local Studies Library has a comprehensive collection from 1841 onwards. #### Land, Building and Property Records

The Local Studies Library has a collection of sale particulars (often with plans) dating from the late 18<sup>th</sup> century; for instance, plans and particulars of valuable freehold farms, common land, cottages and woodland (part of Sheephouse Wood, with the timber growing thereon) and minerals underlying the whole, situate at Midhope Stones and Lower Belle Clive, Hartcliffe in the parish of Penistone in the county of York (*Sheffield Local Studies Library: 28 MAY 1891*)

In addition there are planning applications for Sheffield city (Sheffield City Archives: CA206) and Stocksbridge Urban District Council (Sheffield City Archives: CA759 and CA773) etc.

There are also deeds to properties and records of land valuations which detail owners and occupiers at Sheffield City Archives.

A search of the Archives and Local Studies online catalogues and the card indexes may reveal relevant entries. *(Sheffield City Archives and Sheffield Local Studies Library)* 

As Midhopestones was in the West Riding of Yorkshire until 1974 some land, building and property records may be at <u>West Yorkshire Archives</u>.

Wills and probate records relating to those who died in Midhopestones prior to 1858 are held at the <u>Borthwick Institute for Archives</u> in York. Probate records after 1858 are held at <u>The National Archives</u> (TNA).

Court records will also be held at the <u>West Yorkshire Archive Service</u> and at the <u>National Archives</u>.

<u>The National Archives</u> (TNA) holds records of central government departments and agencies. You can search the <u>TNA catalogue</u> online.

Information on archaeological sites and ancient monuments is held by the <u>South</u> <u>Yorkshire Archaeology Service's Sites and Monuments Record</u>.
