This guide gives a brief introduction to the variety of sources available for researching the history of Mosborough at Sheffield City Archives and Local Studies Library.

Mosborough lies 8 miles south east of Sheffield City Centre. Originally a village in the parish of Eckington in Derbyshire it became part of the city of Sheffield in 1967.

# Church registers and records, monumental (gravestone) inscriptions and cemeteries

St Mark's Mosborough, formerly in the parish of Eckington, Derbyshire, was built in 1886/7 as a 'conventional district' of Eckington. It became a separate parish in 1929. The parish was transferred from the Diocese of Derby to the Diocese of Sheffield in 1973/4.

Records prior to 1877 are at <u>Derbyshire Record Office</u>.

Mosborough was originally in the parish of Eckington in the Diocese of Southwell (created 1884). The parish was subsequently transferred to the Diocese of Derby on its formation in 1927, and to the Diocese of Sheffield in 1974. Archives are located as follows:

#### Courts

The Magistrates Court (or Petty Sessions court) records deal mainly with minor offences and licensing the sale and consumption of liquor. Records of the Sheffield Division cover the borough and City of Sheffield and records of Upper Strafforth and Tickhill Division of West Riding of Yorkshire cover areas outside the borough such as Handsworth, Ecclesfield and Bradfield, c. 1870 - 1976. (Sheffield City Archives: MC)

There are also records of the Court of Quarter Sessions from 1880. (Sheffield City Archives: QS)

#### **Electoral Registers and Poll Books**

Sometimes known as Burgess Rolls or voters' lists, in essence, electoral rolls are lists of people that are entitled to vote. The Sheffield Local Studies Library has a comprehensive collection from 1841 onwards. # **Hospitals**

# Land, Building and Property Records

The Local Studies Library has a collection of sale particulars (often with plans) dating from the late 18<sup>th</sup> century; for instance, particulars and plan of farming land and cottages at Mosbro' Moor Hole, near Mosborough, 1878 (Sheffield Local Studies Library: 16 April 1878).

In addition there are a few planning applications from Chesterfield Rural District Council, which included Mosborough (Sheffield City Archives: CA516 and CA519), as well as Sheffield City Council (Sheffield City Archives: CA206), etc. There may also be planning applications at Derbyshire Record Office.

There are also deeds to properties and records of land valuations which detail owners and occupiers. A search of the Archives and Local Studies online catalogues and the card indexes may reveal relevant entries. (Sheffield City Archives and Sheffield Local Studies Library)

As Mosborough was in Derbyshire until 1967 some land, building and property records may be at <u>Derbyshire Record Office</u>.

# Maps

There are large-scale maps of the Sheffield area from 1853 to the present day. Comprehensive coverage of Sheffield and partial coverage of the surrounding areas is available at Sheffield Local Studies Library. Sheffield City Archives has incomplete historic coverage of most of South Yorkshire. ## **Newspapers**

The two main Sheffield newspapers are the *Sheffield Morning Telegraph* (later *Sheffield Telegraph*) and *The Star*, and these are available on microfilm at Sheffield Local Studies Library. Also available is the *Eckington*, *Woodhouse and Staveley Express and North Derbyshire and South Yorkshire Advertiser*, 1899 - 1940

## Poor Law, Civil Parish and Local Government records

Mosborough was in the parish of Eckington, which, from 1837, came within the Chesterfield Poor Law Union.

As Mosborough was in Chesterfield Poor Law Union, Derbyshire County and Chesterfield Rural District until 1967 records of the poor law and local government may also be available in <a href="Derbyshire Record Office">Derbyshire Record Office</a>.

The parish was subsequently transferred to the Diocese of Derby on its formation in 1927, and, on the creation of the county of South Yorkshire in 1974, Mosborough was transferred to the Diocese of Sheffield. Archives are located as follows:

Diocese of Southwell (1884 - 1927) contact Nottinghamshire Archives. Diocese of Derby (1927 - 1974) contact Derbyshire Record Office. Diocese of Sheffield records are at Sheffield Archives.

Wills and probate records relating to those who died in Mosborough prior to 1858 are held within the Lichfield Diocesan archives at the <u>Lichfield Record Office</u>. Probate records after 1858 are held at <u>The National Archives</u> (TNA).

Court records will be held at the <u>Derbyshire Record Office</u> and at the <u>National</u> Archives.

<u>The National Archives</u> (TNA) holds records of central government departments and agencies. You can search the <u>TNA catalogue</u> online.

Information on archaeological sites and ancient monuments is held by the <u>South</u> Yorkshire Archaeology Service's Sites and Monuments Record.
