## Church registers and records, monumental (gravestone) inscriptions and cemeteries

The parish of St Andrew, Sharrow was formed from parts of the parishes of Ecclesall, All Saints and St Mary, Bramall Lane in 1868.

#### Clubs, Societies and Charities

A search of the online catalogues and the card indexes at Archives and Local Studies may reveal records from Sharrow-based clubs, societies and charities.

Sharrow Amateur Operatic Society programmes (Sheffield Local Studies Library: theatre programmes)

#### Courts

The Magistrates Court (or Petty Sessions court) records deal mainly with minor offences and licensing the sale and consumption of liquor. Records of the Sheffield Division cover the borough and City of Sheffield and records of Upper Strafforth and Tickhill Division of West Riding of Yorkshire cover areas outside the borough such as Handsworth, Ecclesfield and Bradfield, c. 1870 - 1976. *(Sheffield Archives: MC)* 

There are also records of the Court of Quarter Sessions from 1880. *(Sheffield Archives: QS)* 

Prior to 1880 Sharrow came within the jurisdiction of the West Riding Quarter Sessions. Records are held at <u>West Yorkshire Archives</u>.

#### **Electoral Registers and Poll Books**

Sometimes known as Burgess Rolls or voters' lists, in essence, electoral rolls are lists of people that are entitled to vote. The Sheffield Local Studies Library has a comprehensive collection from 1841 onwards. #### Hospitals

Sheffield Archives has records from over 50 hospitals, including annual reports, photographs and administrative records.

#### Land, Building and Property Records

Sale particulars (often with plans) date from the late 18<sup>th</sup> century; some planning applications survive from the late 19<sup>th</sup> century onwards, etc. For instance, Mansion House and nearly three acres of valuable building land at Mount Pleasant, Sheffield *(Sheffield Local Studies Library: sale plan 6 Dec 1870).* 

There are also deeds to properties and records of land valuations which detail owners and occupiers.

A search of the Archives and Local Studies online catalogues and the card indexes may reveal relevant entries.

#### Maps

There are large-scale maps of the Sheffield area from 1853 to the present day. Comprehensive coverage of Sheffield and partial coverage of the surrounding areas is available at Sheffield Local Studies Library. Sheffield Archives has incomplete historic coverage of most of South Yorkshire. #### **Newspapers**

The two main Sheffield newspapers are the *Sheffield Morning Telegraph* (later *Sheffield Telegraph*) and *The Star*, and these are available on microfilm at Sheffield Local Studies Library.

The Sheffield Independent, 1819 - 1900; Sheffield Daily Telegraph 1855 - 1903 and Sheffield Evening Telegraph, 1887 - 1897 are available online at <u>www.britishnewspaperarchive.co.uk/</u>.

#### Schools

Sheffield Archives has records from over 200 schools, including admission registers and head teachers' log books (diaries). For example, there are log books and admission registers for Sharrow Lane Council School from 1887 onwards (Sheffield Archives acc. 2005/153 and 2008/5). #### Other libraries and archives

In addition to information held at Sheffield Archives and Local Studies other library and archive services will also hold relevant material:

Prior to 1914, Sheffield came within the jurisdiction of the Diocese of York. There are extensive archives of the Diocese at the <u>Borthwick Institute for Archives</u> in York.

Wills and probate records relating to those who died in Sheffield prior to 1858 are either held at the <u>Borthwick Institute</u> for Diocese of York parishes or the <u>Lichfield</u> <u>Record Office</u> for areas formerly in the Derbyshire area. Probate records after 1858 are held at <u>The National Archives</u> (TNA).

Court records will also be held at the <u>West Yorkshire Archive Service</u> and at the <u>National Archives</u>.

<u>The National Archives</u> (TNA) holds records of central government departments and agencies. You can search the <u>TNA catalogue</u> online.

Information on archaeological sites and ancient monuments is held by the <u>South</u> <u>Yorkshire Archaeology Service's Sites and Monuments Record</u>.
