This guide gives a brief introduction to the sources available for researching the history of **Stannington** at Sheffield Archives and Local Studies Library.

Stannington is 4.5 miles north-west of Sheffield city centre.

Historically Stannington was a chapelry in Ecclesfield township. Up until 1974 Ecclesfield was in the West Riding of Yorkshire (though some parts had been absorbed into Sheffield as early as 1901). For local government purposes it lay within the Wortley Rural District.

Census returns

These list every resident by household and include names, relationships, occupations, ages and birth places, every 10 years from 1841 through to 1911, available free at every Sheffield library and at Sheffield Archives via www.Ancestry.com

Clubs, Societies and Charities

Courts

The Magistrates Court (or Petty Sessions court) records deal mainly with minor offences and licensing the sale and consumption of liquor. Records of the Sheffield Division cover the borough and City of Sheffield and records of Upper Strafforth and Tickhill Division of West Riding of Yorkshire cover areas outside the borough such as Handsworth, Ecclesfield and Bradfield, c.1870 - 1976. (Sheffield Archives: MC)

There are also records of the Court of Quarter Sessions from 1880. (Sheffield Archives: QS)

For records of West Riding of Yorkshire courts (Stannington was in the West Riding until 1974) contact West Yorkshire Archives.

Electoral Registers and Poll Books

Sometimes known as Burgess Rolls or voters' lists, in essence, electoral rolls are lists of people that are entitled to vote. The Sheffield Local Studies Library has a comprehensive collection from 1841 onwards. For West Riding electoral registers and poll books courts (Stannington was in the West Riding of Yorkshire until 1974) contact West Yorkshire Archives.

Hospitals

As Stannington was in the West Riding of Yorkshire until 1974, older records will be at West Yorkshire Archives.

Land, Building and Property Records

Sale particulars (often with plans) date from the late 18th century; for instance, freehold public-house, cottages and land at Stannington, 22 Jun 1864 (*Sheffield Local Studies Library*).

In addition some planning applications survive from the late 19th century onwards – these include Sheffield City (Sheffield Archives: CA206) and Wortley Rural District Council registers of buildings plans, 1881 - 1936 (Sheffield Archives: CA676; CA529).

There are also deeds to properties and records of land valuations which detail owners and occupiers. (Sheffield Archives)

Maps

There are large-scale maps of the Sheffield area from 1853 to the present day. Comprehensive coverage of Sheffield and partial coverage of the surrounding areas is available at Sheffield Local Studies Library. Sheffield Archives has incomplete historic coverage of most of South Yorkshire. The two main Sheffield newspapers are the *Sheffield Morning Telegraph* (later *Sheffield Telegraph*) and *The Star*, and these are available on microfilm at Sheffield Local Studies Library.

Photographs and Illustrations

In addition to information held at Sheffield Archives and Local Studies other library and archive services will also hold relevant material:

For areas formerly in the West Riding of Yorkshire (Stannington was in the West Riding until 1974) there may be relevant records at the <u>West Yorkshire Archives</u> Service.

Prior to 1914, Stannington came within the jurisdiction of the Diocese of York. There are extensive archives of the Diocese at the <u>Borthwick Institute for Archives</u> in York.

Wills and probate records relating to those who died in Stannington prior to 1858 are held at the <u>Borthwick Institute for Archives</u> in York. Probate records after 1858 are held at <u>The National Archives</u> (TNA).

Court records will also be held at the <u>West Yorkshire Archive Service</u> and at the <u>National Archives</u>.

<u>The National Archives</u> (TNA) holds records of central government departments and agencies. You can search the TNA catalogue online.

Information on archaeological sites and ancient monuments is held by the <u>South Yorkshire Archaeology Service's Sites and Monuments Record</u>.
