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#### Introduction

This *Guide* lists sources available within Sheffield Libraries Archives and Information for the study of the development and consumption of food and drink through the last 500 years. It lists references to food and drink - including cookery books and recipes, dietary sheets and menus and other items in the collections at Sheffield City Archives and Local Studies Library.

A search of the service's <u>catalogues</u> and card indexes may reveal additional items of relevance to this topic. Note this guide excludes the subject of food adulteration and food safety. It also excludes <u>temperance</u> for which there is a separate guide.

Order of Gilbert, Earl of Shrewsbury, that Elizabeth Heywood of Sheffield, widow, be allowed to sell the 'white meates, chiefly butter and cheese', which she brings to Sheffield from Ashbourne [Derbyshire] and other markets, for the benefit of the handicraft men, 'who have no meanes to make provision but only in the markett', 1608

Entries are normally in columns for oats, beans, wheat, rye and barley. (Sheffield City Archives: WWM/A)

Short, Thomas, A comparative history of the increase and decrease of mankind in England, and several countries abroad ...; to which is added, a syllabus of the general states of health, air, seasons, and food for the last three hundred years [1468 - 1765]; and also a meteorological discourse, 1767 (Sheffield Local Studies Library: 312 SSTQ)

Wentworth Woodhouse household accounts - housekeeper's books of stores, c. 1769 - 1848 include quantities in hand and consumed weekly, of sugar, dried fruits, soap, tea, homemade wines, distilled waters, etc. (Sheffield City Archives: WWM/A/1365-1388)

For example Gales and Martin's Directory of Sheffield of 1787 lists such occupations as grocer, tea dealer, milk and flour dealer, dealer in butter and groceries, cheese factor, poulterer, dealer in bacon, wine and spirit dealer, etc (Sheffield Local Studies Library and Sheffield City Archives)

Sale plans may contain details of land and buildings connected to food and drink, for example, beerhouses, orchards, dairies, shops, etc., 18<sup>th</sup> - 21st centuries (Sheffield Local Studies Library: sale plans)
