


Hillsborough Football Disaster: A Bibliography











Hillsborough Stadium Football Disaster, 15 April 1989

At the FA Cup semi final between Liverpool and Nottingham Forest which was held at Sheffield Wednesday's Hillsborough Stadium on 15 April 1989 a tragedy unfolded that involved the death of many Liverpool supporters.

As the kick-off time approached there was an increasing crush outside the Leppings Lane turnstiles. To avoid injury, the police decided to open an exit gate to let more fans into the stadium. This resulted in a major influx of fans into an already crowded part of the ground, causing many to be crushed against security and crush barriers on the terraces in the West Stand. 96 of them died from their injuries.

An inquiry, chaired by Lord Justice Taylor, published its findings (known as the Taylor report) in August 1989 and January 1990. It outlined the events of that day and made a number of recommendations on football stadium design.

The memories of that tragic day are still raw and the controversy about who was responsible continues. During the two decades that have passed a large amount of material has been published or otherwise made available. This <u>Bibliography</u> provides a detailed list of much of that information. We would welcome details of any articles, books, films or websites that have been inadvertently omitted¹.
