# Introduction

This *Guide* lists sources available in the Sheffield Local Studies Library and Sheffield Archives relating to the public parks and gardens in the city. It is not intended to be a detailed history but aims to direct researchers to the most appropriate publications and documents.

It lists general sources for researching the history and development of the parks, including the records of the Council and the various committees that have been responsible for them, and also sources relating to a selection of the best known and most important parks. A full list of all the parks in the city can be found on the Parks and Countryside section of the City Council's website at <a href="http://www.sheffield.gov.uk/out--about/parks-woodlands--countryside/parks/city-district-local-parks">www.sheffield.gov.uk/out--about/parks-woodlands--countryside/parks/city-district-local-parks</a>. Other parks can be researched using the general sources listed here together with material in the Local Studies and Archives catalogues.

From their earliest days the parks have been used as a venue for music and entertainment and for a wide range of other events including sports, fairs and galas, Royal visits and other ceremonies. The guide lists references for a representative selection of these activities and also for the playgrounds, open air swimming pools and golf courses closely associated with parks. Finally there are references to some of the benefactors and horticulturalists who have helped to create the parks.

More items are continually being added to the online catalogues and new material is also regularly added to the collections. It is always worth contacting the service points or checking our website for updates to this Study Guide. Our contact details are on the back cover.


Botanical Gardens in the Sheffield Mercury. Local Studies Library: Newspaper collection Sheffield is justifiably proud of the parks which make it one of the greenest cities in Europe. It has not always been the case, as James Smith observed in his *Report on the conditions of the Town of Sheffield* for the Royal Commission on Health of Towns in 1842, 'There are no public gardens or open space of any extent for the people to walk and enjoy themselves in'. The need to provide space for recreation in urban areas had been recognised but the only formal provision in Sheffield was the Botanical Gardens, owned by a private company and only open to subscribers except on a few days each year.


In 1841 the Duke of Norfolk proposed laying out part of the former Sheffield Park to provide recreational space for the working classes. Norfolk Park opened in 1848 and although it remained in private ownership until 1909, the public was allowed access at all times. It was one of the earliest public parks in the country.

The involvement of local authorities began with the 1860 Public Improvements Act which permitted the levy of a rate to pay for the maintenance of open spaces. The Town Council purchased the Weston Hall estate in 1873 and Robert Marnock was commissioned to design the new park. Weston Park became Sheffield's first municipal park.





The creation of parks was a matter of great civic pride and in 1897 the Citv Council's General Purposes and Parks Committee recorded its achievements in a book. Plans and descriptions of parks and recreation grounds, which detailed 6 major parks – Endcliffe Woods, Firth Park, High Hazels Park, Hillsborough Park, Meersbrook Park and Weston Park - and a number of smaller recreation grounds in builtup areas.

Parks continued to be acquired through donation and purchase, including Norfolk Park gifted to the city by the Duke of Norfolk, and the Town Trustees took over the Botanical Gardens and opened them to the public. This period also saw the further development of sports and recreational facilities. Sports pitches, boating lakes and refreshment pavilions were supplemented by bowling greens and tennis courts, Sheffield's first municipal golf course and a bathing pool in the Rivelin Valley. Music was also popular and bandstands were provided in the major parks. Parks also became the venue for large public events.



Correspondence with the Sheffield Photo Co. regarding cinematograph displays in the parks to mark the Coronation of King George V in 1911 Sheffield Archives: CA776/2/5 In 1924 Professor Patrick Abercrombie published his report, Sheffield: a civic survey and suggestions towards a development plan, which called for a doubling of the acreage of Sheffield's open spaces. Thanks largely to the generosity of J.G. Graves, the famous Round Walk was completed and Graves and Concord Parks were opened. Smaller gardens such as the City Hall Gardens and Beauchief Gardens were also created and a number of playgrounds opened in built up areas. During the Second World War the Parks Department's Holidays at Home programme, intended to encourage people to spend leisure time close to home, was one of the most successful in the country and it was estimated that use of the parks doubled during the war.









The post-war years saw the opening of Whirlow Brook Park, contributions to the Festival of Britain in 1951 and the transition of the wartime Food Production Show into the Sheffield Show. However there was also the beginning of a gradual decline in the use of parks as changes in the use of leisure time and greater mobility took effect. Some developments such as the Millhouses Lido attempted to cater for new demands but other facilities were lost and financial pressures would later lead to reduced maintenance and security, vandalism and little encouragement for people to use the parks.

Newspaper collection

The emergence of voluntary 'friends' groups has been a key factor in reversing the decline and external grants have been obtained to help restore some of the historic parks such as the Botanical Gardens and Norfolk Park. In the city centre the Peace Gardens were remodelled and the Winter Garden created as part of the Heart of the City Project. There is even a new park taking shape in the Sheaf Valley.

#### Maps

A comprehensive collection of Ordnance Survey maps is available at Sheffield Local Studies Library. Sheffield Archives have incomplete historic coverage.

Before the Second World War maps were produced as a County Series at a scale of 6 inches to 1 mile (1:10,560) and 1:2,500 (25 inches to 1 mile). As Sheffield lies on the

boundary of Yorkshire and Derbyshire and has extended its boundaries at various times, this sometimes leads to confusion:

Yorkshire – six-inch maps for this area were first published 1853-55. 1:2,500 maps were published in 1890 and revised in about 1905, 1923 and 1935.

Derbyshire – six-inch and 1:2,500 maps were first published in 1876 and revised in about 1898, 1923 and 1938.

There are also town plans of Sheffield (these do not cover the whole of the present city):

1853 at 1:1056 scale

1890-93/1903 at 1:500 scale

The National Grid survey began in 1949 and continues to the present day. Maps are available at 1:10,000, 1:2,500 and 1:1,250 scales.
