









LANGUAGE

Bengali is the official language of Bangladesh, and is spoken by some 1,151 people in Sheffield, although a number of this group may be from India, where Bengali is also widely spoken. Census data is unable to determine the proportion of Bengali speakers who are also Bangladeshi. 30% of those who speak Bengali as a main language cannot speak English, or don't speak English very well.


















Proportion of pupils achieving 5 or more GCSEs at A^* - C including maths and English





The proportion of Bangladeshi 16 to 18 year olds not in education, employment or training (NEET)





DIABETES

Nationally, the prevalence of doctor-diagnosed diabetes is significantly higher amongst Bangladeshi men, 8.2%, and women, 5.2%, compared with the averages of 4.3% and 3.4%, respectively.



SMOKING

40% of Bangladeshi men in England are current smokers, compared with 24% of all males. Only 2% of Bangladeshi women smoke, in comparison to 23% total female population.
