The above three charts show the number of children aged 10 -17 nationally, number of children 10 - 17 in Sheffield and Sheffield offending population.

23% of Sheffield 10 - 17 year olds are BAME. The BAME % is higher in Sheffield's offending population (29%). YP sentenced to custodial sentences (April 2019 - March 2020)




The figures show a reduction in young people committing knife offences when comparing 2018/19 to 2019/20


More BAME YP committing less serious offences but more BAME sentenced to custody than White YP.




Number of Asian young
