- 1. No person shall drive any vehicle at a speed exceeding 20 miles per hour on any lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.
- 2. No speed limit imposed by this order applies to vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011 when use in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those regulations.
- 3. This Order shall come into operation on the day of and may be cited as The Sheffield City Council (Highfield) (20 MPH Speed Limit) Order 2022.
