School Food Supplement Vouchers: Update

Key Messages

Forum members are asked to:

 Note the ongoing support that we are providing to eligible families, via the Household Support Fund, as detailed below.

1. Background

- 1.1. Since October 2020, Sheffield City Council (SCC) has provided food vouchers in excess of £11.4m to 32,500 vulnerable families and children in the city; initially via the Covid Winter Support Grant and as of October 2021 this has been funded via the Household Support Fund (HSF).
- 1.2. This arrangement has now been extended until February 2023 half term (the HSF scheme has been approved up to 31 March 2023) and we will shortly be issuing a further round of vouchers for October half-term. The scheme was originally announced to the public in October 2021 and Sheffield received £5.2m of funding. In that round of funding, at least 50% (£2.6m) of the total funding was required to be spent on families with children. In the second extension (October 2022- March 2023), the Government has instructed that at least one third (£1.73m) of the total funding must be spent on families with children.
- 1.3. Voucher amounts vary depending on the length of the school holidays and the funding available, but the value has been typically a minimum of £15.

2. October Half-term and Future Cohorts

- 2.1. During the week commencing 10 October, 32,500 families with children that are eligible for benefit-related free school meals will receive a £15 food supplement voucher for each child to help cover the costs of food over the October half term. Families in receipt of income-assessed Early Years Support (2-4yr olds), or young people leaving their care setting (Care Leavers) are also eligible.
- 2.2. We continue to use Edenred as the voucher supplier and families have a choice of 10 supermarkets including: Aldi, Tesco, Asda, Morrisons, Sainsburys, Waitrose, M&S, McColl's, Iceland, and Farm foods. Parents/carers can download their vouchers for more than one supermarket.



- 2.3. Vouchers are redeemed using a 16-digit code which is provided in the letter sent to families and which needs to be activated within 3 months. Once redeemed on the Edenred website, the voucher will be valid for 12 months.
- 2.4. We have received confirmation of the continuation of the grant up to February 2023 and will therefore be planning future voucher issues for Christmas 2022 and February half-term 2023 at a weekly allocation of £15 per week.
