(YORKSHIRE AND THE HUMBER)

(NO. 35) ORDER 2013

Made 15 November 013

The Secretary of State makes this Order in exercise of powers under section 247 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 ("the Act").

- 1. The Secretary of State authorises the stopping up of the highway described in the Schedule to this Order and shown zebra hatched black on the plan, in order to enable development to be carried out in accordance with the planning permission granted under Part III of the Act by Sheffield City Council under reference 13/02539/FUL.
- 2. 1) The developer shall to the reasonable satisfaction of the Council provide:-
 - (a) new highway along the route shown by stipple on the plan; and
 - (b) improvement of the highway Charles Street, Norfolk Street and Union Street shown by cross hatching on the plan.
 - (2) The new highway shall be a highway which for the purposes of the Highways Act 1980 is a highway maintainable at the public expense and the Council shall be the highway authority for it.
- 3. Where immediately before the date of this Order there is any apparatus of statutory undertakers under, in, on, over, along or across any highway authorised to be stopped up pursuant to this Order then, subject to section 261(4) of the Act, those undertakers shall have the same rights as respects that apparatus after that highway is stopped up as they had immediately beforehand.
- 4. In this Order -

"the Council"

means Sheffield City Council

"the developer"

means CTP (Wakefield) Ltd

"the plan"

means the plan numbered NATTRAN/Y&H/S247/1073, marked "Highway at Sheffield in the City of Sheffield", signed by authority of the Secretary of State and deposited at the Department for Transport, Deposit Document Service, F Floor, Ashdown House, St Leonards on Sea, Hastings, East Sussex, TN37 7GA.

5. This Order shall come into force on the date on which notice that it has been made is first published in accordance with section 252(10) of the Act, and may be cited as the Stopping Up of Highway (Yorkshire and the Humber) (No. 35) Order 2013.

Description of highway to be stopped up

The highway to be stopped up is at Sheffield in the City of Sheffield and is shown zebra hatched black on the plan. It is an irregular shaped northern part width of Charles Street and an eastern part width of Norfolk Street comprising footway commencing 12 metres north east of the northern corner of Howden House extending in a north westerly direction for a distance of 6.4 metres then in a north easterly direction for 6.8 metres and having a maximum width of 2 metres.
