  - No Waiting Monday to Saturday 8.00am to 6.30pm on parts of Hallam Grange Crescent.

#### STATEMENT OF REASONS

The Authority's reasons for proposing to make the above named Order(s) are as follows:-

- For avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising, or
- For facilitating the passage on the road or any other road of any class of traffic (including pedestrians), or
- For preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the road runs

#### **Explanatory Note:-**

**Bridle Stile, Queen Street, Chapel Street and Plumbley Hall Road -** The proposed no waiting at any time restriction is required to facilitate the movement of traffic and to improve visibility at the junctions for all road users.

**Chapel Street and Duke Street** - The proposed no waiting at any time restriction is required to prevent obstructive parking occurring at unsuitable locations in the area and to improve access, visibility and safety for all road users.

Clay Wheels Lane and Limestone Cottage Lane - The proposed no waiting at any time restriction is required to facilitate improved access to commercial units and prevent obstructive parking.

**Darwin Lane and Tetney Road** - The proposed no waiting at any time restriction is required to prevent obstructive parking occurring at unsuitable locations on the road and to improve access, visibility and safety for all road users at junctions and accesses.

**Ecclesfield Road, Chapeltown** - The proposed no waiting at any time restriction is required to prevent obstructive parking occurring at the pedestrian crossing point outside Ecclesfield School. The restriction will improve access, visibility and safety, especially for pedestrians, at this location.

**Firshill Crescent** - The proposed no waiting at any time restriction is required to facilitate the movement of traffic and improve visibility, access and safety for all road users.

**Firth Park Crescent and Firth Park Road -** The proposed no waiting at any time restriction is required to prevent obstructive parking where it is occurring at unsuitable locations to improve access, visibility and safety for all road users especially when a football match is taking place.

**Hallam Grange Crescent** - The proposed no waiting at any time restriction and no waiting Monday to Friday 8am to 6.30pm is required to facilitate the movement of traffic and to improve access, visibility and safety for all road users especially pedestrians at school time start and end times.

**Jermyn Close and Jermyn Crescent** - The proposed no waiting at any time restriction is required to facilitate the movement of traffic and improve access, visibility and safety at the junction for all road users.

**Keats Road** - The proposed no waiting at any time restriction is required to facilitate the movement of traffic and improve access, visibility and safety outside Fox Hill Primary School for all road users.

**Knowle Road and Tunwell Avenue** - The proposed no waiting at any time restriction is required to facilitate the movement of traffic and improve access, visibility and safety at the junction for all road users.

**Longacre Way** - The proposed no waiting at any time restriction is required to facilitate improved access to commercial units and to improve access, visibility and safety at the junction for all road users.

**Wadsley Lane and Marlcliffe Road -** The proposed no waiting at any time restriction is required to prevent obstructive parking at unsuitable locations to improve access, visibility and safety and for all road users especially when a football match takes place.

**Riggs Low Road and Stannington Road -** The proposed no waiting at any time restriction is required to facilitate the movement of traffic and improve access, visibility and safety at the junction for all road users.

**Stevenson Road, Stevenson Way and Oakes Green** - The proposed no waiting at any time restriction is required to facilitate access/egress from the commercial units and to improve access, visibility and safety at the junctions for all road users.
