## **Sheffield Tree Archiving project**

## **Progress report: January – March 2022**

This document outlines the progress made in January - March 2022 for archiving and publishing information held by Sheffield City Council and others in relation to the street trees management between 2013-2018.

- 1. Documents have continued to be passed to the Archives Team for processing.
- 2. Approximately 5,500 documents have been transferred for archiving 1.
- 3. An additional Archivist has been appointed.
- 4. Training in the use of eDiscovery (for searching email accounts) by the Archivists has been completed.
- 5. The Project Archivists have continued to catalogue material which has been transferred to the City Archives. Cataloguing completed during this period:

- 6. Significant progress has been made in searching a number of email accounts for relevant emails. Processing these ready for publication will begin shortly.
- 7. The work on preparing original documents for publication converting all raw files to pdf format, running Optical Character Recognition (OCR) so they are searchable, combining single documents into more manageable sizes has continued.
- 8. Some test catalogues (comprising information already in the public domain) have been published and tested.

The number of documents published will be less than the number of individual documents held within the archive as many will be combined into larger document groups to make navigation and searching easier.
