

This guide gives a brief introduction to the variety of sources available for researching the history of Loxley at Sheffield City Archives and Local Studies Library.

Loxley is 4 miles north west of Sheffield. For local government purposes it was in the West Riding of Yorkshire and Wortley Rural District until 1974 when it was transferred to the city of Sheffield.

Businesses

Industry was established in the Loxley area in the middle of the 17th century when the first mills were set up on the River Loxley. Steel and iron forging and rolling mills were established. During the 1800s the Loxley Valley became a producer of refractory bricks used in casting steel which were made from fireclay, prevalent in the Loxley and Stannington area.

Clubs, Societies and Charities

A search of the online catalogues and the card indexes at Archives and Local Studies may reveal records from Loxley-based clubs, societies and charities. For example: records of the Almshouse Charity of Hannah Rawson, which erected houses in 1840 for poor widows in the Wadsley Parish Church district (*Sheffield City Archives: X232*).

Courts

The Magistrates Court (or Petty Sessions court) records deal mainly with minor offences and licensing the sale and consumption of liquor. Records of the Sheffield Division cover the borough and City of Sheffield and records of Upper Strathmore and Tickhill Division of West Riding of Yorkshire cover areas outside the borough such as Handsworth, Ecclesfield and Bradfield.

Electoral Registers and Poll Books

Sometimes known as Burgess Rolls or voters' lists, in essence, electoral rolls are lists of people that are entitled to vote. The Sheffield Local Studies Library has a comprehensive collection from 1841 onwards. Sheffield City Archives has records from over 50 hospitals, including annual reports, photographs and administrative records.

Land, Building and Property Records

The Local Studies Library has a collection of sale particulars (often with plans) dating from the late 18th century; for instance, Plans and particulars of valuable freehold and copyhold farms and farm lands situate at Loxley and Worrall in the county of York, 19 October 1880 (*Sheffield Local Studies Library: Sale Plans*). In addition there are planning applications for Sheffield city (*Sheffield City Archives: CA206*) and Wortley Rural District Council registers of building plans, 1881 - 1936 (*Sheffield City Archives: CA676*); etc. For example: Alterations to Loxley House, Ben Lane to form 10 flats and 4 work stations and erection of 4 terraced cottages and alterations to widen gate access (*Sheffield City Archives: CA206/1999/429P*). There may also be deeds to properties and records of land valuations which detail owners and occupiers at Sheffield City Archives.

A search of the Archives and Local Studies online catalogues and the card indexes may reveal relevant entries.

Maps

There are large-scale maps of the Sheffield area from 1853 to the present day. Comprehensive coverage of Sheffield and partial coverage of the surrounding areas is available at Sheffield Local Studies Library. Sheffield City Archives has incomplete historic coverage of most of South Yorkshire. The two main Sheffield newspapers are the *Sheffield Morning Telegraph* (later *Sheffield Telegraph*) and *The Star*, and these are available on microfilm at Sheffield Local Studies Library.
