POSITION STATEMENT ON THE CITY COUNCIL'S DUTY TO INVESTIGATE FLOODING

1. Duty to Investigate

- 1.1 The Flood and Water Management Act 2010 places a duty on the City Council, as Lead Local Flood Authority (LLFA), to investigate flooding in its area arising from whatever source.
- 1.2 Section 19 of the Act states:
 - (1) On becoming aware of a flood in its area, an LLFA must, to the extent that it considers it necessary and appropriate, investigate –
 - (a) which risk management authorities have relevant flood risk management functions and
 - (b) whether each of those risk management has exercised, or is proposing to exercise, those functions in response to the flood.
 - (2) Where an authority carries out an investigation under subsection (1) it must
 - (a) publish the results of its investigation, and
 - (b) notify any relevant risk management authorities.

2. Threshold Criteria for a Section 19 Investigation

- 2.1 When the Council becomes aware of a flooding incident, it must decide whether the incident requires a Section 19 investigation.
- 2.2 To inform this decision, the City Council has set the following flooding threshold criteria for its area:
 - a) 6 or more residential, business or commercial properties are affected by internal flooding and/or
 - b) 1 or more critical infrastructure facility is, or is close to being, adversely affected by flooding (such as a hospital, medical centre or clinic, nursing home, school, electrical sub-station, emergency service station etc) and/or
 - c) A principal transport link has been made totally impassable for a significant period at a peak time.
- 2.3 Other factors that will be taken into account in determining whether a Section 19 flooding investigation is required are:
 - a) depth and/or velocity of flooding (risk to life and limb).
 - b) frequency of flooding at the location.
 - c) requests to investigate received from elected members, committees or other elected bodies.

Please note that the above thresholds and factors are a guide and a certain degree of flexibility and professional judgement may also be required when deciding whether to proceed with a statutory investigation.

3. Flooding Investigation Process

- 3.1 The decision to formally enter into a section 19 flooding investigation will be taken by the Director of Development Services within the City Council. The investigation will be led by the Land Drainage and Flood Risk Management (LD&FRM) team in the Development Services directorate.
- 3.2 The LD&FRM team will be responsible for capturing all evidence and information deemed necessary to support the investigation. Should a significant flooding incident occur outside normal working hours, initial evidence will be gathered by the Council's appointed emergency response contractor using the investigation sheet at Appendix A of this report.
- 3.3 Following evidence gathering, an initial assessment will be made into:
 - a) the cause, source and mechanism of flooding;
 - b) the consequences including those properties, persons and infrastructure affected
 - c) the risk management authority responsible for managing the flood risk.
 - d) what has been done or is being done.
- 3.4 The LD&FRM team will contact the relevant flood risk management authorities and convene a multi-agency review meeting at which the evidence and initial assessment will be reviewed and agreement reached on any further actions including timescales.
- 3.5 The City Council will write a draft investigation report and present to relevant risk management authorities for agreement.
- 3.6 Following agreement, the City Council will publish the report and notify the relevant risk management authorities.
