STATEMENT OF REASONS

Brookhouse Hill and Long Causeway

The effect of the Experimental Order will be to introduce no waiting at any time (double yellow lines) and no stopping on verge or footway at any time to prevent obstructive parking on roads near popular destinations. There has been increased parking at these locations causing highway accessibility and safety problems and damaging the natural environment.

Ardmore Street and Manners Street

The proposed prohibition of driving is required to prevent fly tipping and other unlawful activities on these streets which are not required for highway purposes.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on the 5th day of August, 2021 The Sheffield City Council will seal the above Order which will come into operation on the 12th day of August, 2021 under the provisions of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Order will be to introduce Prohibition of Waiting At Any Time and Prohibition of Stopping on Verge or Footway At Any Time on parts of Brookhouse Hill and Long Causeway.

The restrictions will prevent obstructive parking on roads near popular leisure destinations. There has been increased parking at these locations causing highway accessibility and safety problems. Redmires reservoir is in the Peak District National Park and is home to rare and protected species. The ditches and verges around the reservoir are a place where rare plants like Orchids grow as well as Water Vole and the Common Toad. The verges also help trap sediment and pollution before it reaches the reservoir, which helps maintain water quality.

- a) In Part II Waiting and Loading Restriction Article 3 thereto, there was included the following items:-
- j) Save as provided in Article 3 k) no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle to stop on the verge or footway of a carriageway as specified in the Schedule listed in Column 1 of Table 1B to this Order during the times relating to that Schedule as specified in Column 2 of that Table.
- k) Nothing in Article 3 j) shall render it unlawful for a vehicle to wait if it is doing so in circumstances provided for in the exemptions listed in Column 3 to Table 1B related to the Schedules listed in Column 1 and described in Article 6 to this Order.
- I) Nothing in Article 3 j) shall render it unlawful for a vehicle to stop in any road specified in any Schedule listed in Column 1 to Table 1B to enable the vehicle to be used for the fire brigade, ambulance or police in an emergency.


