Ashfurlong Road

The Independent Tree Panel has reviewed the Council's plan for nine trees on Ashfurlong Road. We have taken into the account the technical information provided by the Council and the concerns raised by residents in their response to the household survey. We inspected the trees on 28 January 2016. We reinspected five of the trees on 31 May 2016. We have referred to the engineering solutions, as presented to the Highway Tree Advisory Forum on 2 September [2015] which are referred to in section 3.2 of the Streets Ahead Five Year Management Strategy 2012 – 2017 dated January 2016.

Household survey

Eight of the trees you propose to remove and replace are on the east-west running arm of the road. The remaining tree is on the other arm of the road. There are 50 households on Ashfurlong Road. 10 responded to the survey, of which five objected to the proposed removal and replacement of the trees.

Tree already removed

The tree outside number 33 has already been removed and replaced. We <u>advise</u> that the Council should take steps to prevent this happening again.

Trees which are diseased or damaged

The tree outside number 15 has minor decay at its base, and some crown dieback. It does not appear to be structurally compromised. However, dead branches could fall from the tree into the neighbouring garden. The tree is an area which has many other trees. In these circumstances, we <u>advise</u> that the Council would be justified in removing and replacing this tree.

Trees which are diseased or damaged, and causing damage

The trees outside numbers 4, 6, 8, 16, 18 and 20 are in poor condition with varying degrees of damage or decay, which could be exacerbated by works to the pavement. These trees are also causing some damage to the pavement and possibly to adjacent property. They cause a significant narrowing of parts of the pavement. We <u>advise</u> that the Council would be justified in removing and replacing these trees.

Trees which are healthy and for which no other action appears to be needed

The tree outside number 35 is in reasonable condition and is causing no discernible damage to pavement, verge or road. We <u>advise</u> that we could find no case for the removal and replacement of this tree.

I have enclosed a tabulated summary of our conclusions.
