The Logo

There is only one Council logo, no other logos can be used to represent Sheffield City Council. It is essential that the logo is always used according to these standards.

The logo can be reproduced in a single colour, however it is important that the colour used is strong enough to be visible and the type legible against the background.

The logo must not be altered in any way from the original, in shape, proportions and typefaces.

The logo must not be used in conjunction with any type to form another logo.







The Logo: Sizes

Minimum size

The logo must never be reduced below 15mm in width. The width and height dimensions must always appear in proportion and should never be expanded, condensed or distorted.

Positioning the Logo: Printed Material

When the logo appears on **printed material** representing the council, it should be positioned to the front face in the bottom right hand corner.

The exact position is dependent on the selected margin widths as illustrated.

This means that any printed or published material for example, posters, leaflets, brochures, booklets, reports, displays, exhibition, J.C. Decaux posters, postcards, advertising hoardings, will follow this standards.







Internal Signage

The implementation of Section 21 of the Disability Discrimination Act (DDA) means that we have a legal obligation to meet the needs of our blind and partially sighted staff and customers.

There is a need for a consistent approach to signage to ensure that identification and direction is provided in a uniform, easy to interpret format that is accessible to everyone and in particular addresses the needs of those who are visually impaired.

As a measure of good practice we should ensure that:

- All internal low level signage includes Braille and tactile information as specified by the RNIB.
- The sign panel, frame and text colours make it easy to read - maximum contrast.
- Signs use British Standard symbols
- Signs are colour co-ordinated to building interiors

Joint Branding

If the Council is the lead organisation then the council identity should be applied with the inclusion of any funded partner or sponsor logos.

Where funded partnership exists between the Council and another organisation, our logo should appear on all promotional material and be given equal weight and prominence to any other logos.



Clothing

Standard T-shirt

The Council logo should appear in full colour, solid white or solid black printed on the left hand front of a white, dark blue or dark green garment.

The service name may appear on the right hand side - however to achieve economies of scale we recommend the standard T-shirt.

Event T-shirt

If the garment is for a specific campaign or event - the relevant styling/colourways can be included as illustrated.



Clothing

High Visibility Clothing

Hi visibility vests will carry the logo printed on the left hand side front and Sheffield City Council to the back.





Formal shirts, as worn by City Centre Ambassadors will carry the logo on the left hand breast pocket and post title on the right.

Outer garments - fleeces, jackets etc. should be dark blue or dark green with the Council logo.

Exclusions to this are firstPOINT staff, Town Hall Attendants, Parking Attendants and some safety clothing.

Safer, more reliable safety barriers coming soon

Sheffield's highway fences, bollards and barriers are essential in making sure pedestrians and vehicles can move freely and safely.

Our city's street furniture for example benches and seating, cycle stands and artefacts all help to make Sheffield an attractive place to live, work and visit. Therefore it is important that that these assets are well maintained.

As part of the Streets Ahead project we will be cleaning, repairing or replacing where necessary the city's street furniture, as well as making Sheffield's roads and pavements safer by upgrading and installing new safety fencing and pedestrian barriers where necessary.

Improved signage and technology coming soon

As part of the Streets Ahead project, we'll be improving the safety of our city by making sure that there is fully functional traffic signals to manage traffic flows and minimise congestion, appropriate pedestrians crossings to help people across busy roads, and good quality signage and street nameplates for easy travel.

In the first five years

Our planned improvement works will see approximately 25 per cent of our traffic lights





Also during this time our Streets Ahead provider, Amey, will be:

- Repairing traffic detection at traffic lights so that they function correctly and efficiently
- Introducing above ground traffic detection wherever possible to improve the efficiency of future maintenance works - we won't need to dig up the roads again to fix any future faults
- Replacing corroded and damaged signal poles
- Painting all the signal poles black
- Replacing electronic signage around Meadowhall to guide shoppers to the nearest available car park

Did you know?

Our Streets Ahead provider is responsible for maintaining on our behalf:

- 297 traffic signal junctions
- 201 pedestrain crossings
- 110 variable message signs



New litter and recycling bins coming soon

Our aim is to maintain a high-quality environment in Sheffield that is clean, safe, vibrant, welcoming and attractive. As part of the Streets Ahead project, we'll be installing over 1,000 new litter and recycling bins to encourage more people to dispose of their waste responsibily and keep our city tidy.

Our Streets Ahead provider, Amey, is responsible for our street cleaning service on our behalf, which includes the removal of:

- litter
- flytipping
 flyposting
- graffiti
- gully cleaning
- dead animals from the highway

They will also install, repair and empty litter bins on our behalf throughout the 25 year Streets Ahead contract.

In the first five years

1,000 new litter and recycling bins will be introduced across the city in the first five years, known as the core investment period, of the 25 year contract.

We've also invested in some new solar powered mechanical bins that conveniently tell us when they're full. The power generated by the sun allows the bin to crush and compact the rubbish inside at regular intervals so that it can accommodate more waste. The bins will be strategically positioned in the city's more rural areas where the bins tend to require empting less frequently.

These mechanical compressing bins will mean that our Streets Ahead provider, Amey, can deliver a more efficient cleaning service for the city. It eliminates the need for spot checks and reduces unnecessary journeys meaning we can focus on cleaning Sheffield's litter hot spots.

Did you know?

- There are over 2,500 litter bins across Sheffield. 1,000 more are being installed as part of the Streets Ahead project.
- It is a criminal offence to drop litter or throw it from a car and you could be fined £75
- Biodegradable things like apple cores, banana skins, even breadcrumbs is litter

Help keep Sheffield tidy

Litter is the most visible sign of pollution. It is unsightly and can cause harm to people, wildlife and pollutes our waterways. It encourages pests as well as the spread of germs and diseases. You can help us by:

- Not dropping litter on the street
- Ensuring that litter bins are not overfilled use the next available bin to dispose of your waste
- Not disposing of household rubbish in our public litter bins
- Clearing up after your dog disposing of it safely and appropriately in a litter bin



Brighter, more energy efficient streetlights coming soon

We know that good quality street lighting is an important factor in helping to reduce crime and the fear of crime; whilst improving road safety.

As part of the Streets Ahead project, your current street lighting is being replaced with state-of-the-art Light Emitting Diode (LED) technology designed to improve the overall quality of our street lighting network across our city. The LED lighting will provide brighter 'white light' to improve visibility and safety as well as reducing carbon emissions.

In the first five years

We'll be replacing and repositioning over 58,000 street lighting columns across the city. To do this we'll need to carry out excavation works in the pavement to connect the new lighting to the electricity cable. We will inform you by letter when we will be replacing street lights.

How will the new lighting differ?

Your new street lighting will look significantly different to what you are used to mainly because of new street lighting positions. It is very likely that your new lighting columns will be sited in different positions on your street.

This is to make sure that there is an even distribution of light that meets current British standards. Each street across Sheffield will have a unique street lighting design that takes into account things such as the type of road you live on, the current streetscene, the height of houses and buildings and the number of trees on the street.

Benefits of the new lighting

There are many benefits the new street lighting will bring to you and your community including:

- Improved community safety (the 'white light' allows a wider spectrum of colours to be seen and facial features to be distinguished. As a result, many people feel safer)
- Reduced energy use and light pollution (LEDs are more energy efficient and will help to reduce current carbon emissions by over 50 per cent)
- An even distribution of light
- Reduced risk to motorists
- A central control monitoring system (After the five years replacement programme the LEDs will be managed by this system which will automatically detect when lights are not operating correctly. Therefore we will no longer be reliant on inspections and public reports. This system also allows us to optimise lighting levels based on road usage and circumstances)

Our Streets Ahead provider is responsible for maintaining on our behalf:

- 68,000 street lighting columns
- 5,000 other electrically powered apparatus
- 7,000 illuminated signs
- 1,000 illuminated bollards

Clean and clear highway gullies and drains coming soon

As part of the Streets Ahead project, we have plans to inspect and repair flood prone gullies and drains across the city. For the first time they will be visually inspected to understand their condition and our Streets Ahead provider, Amey, is developing a planned programme of improvement works and repairs.

These works vary from simply replacing gully grates and pots to more complex works like installing completely new drainage systems to improve the removal of water from the highway. These works are essential and will significantly help prevent flooding in the future.

In the first five years

We'll be carrying out 129 improvement drainage schemes across the city within the first 5 years between 2012 – 2017 known as the core investment period, of the 25 year contract.

Also we'll be replacing 3,000 sub-standard gullies across the city. A further 3000 will be replaced over the remaining 20 years of the contract.

Benefits

At the end of these works Sheffield will be less vulnerable to flooding and the disruption and harm it causes.

Please help us

Parked cars often prevent us from cleaning gullies. So we aim to give you as much advance notice as possible through temporary signage on the road that will inform you when we need to clean the gullies in your area.

We can get our works completed quicker, if you:


- Pay attention to our signage

- Find alternative parking if necessary until the cleaning operation has finished

Safer, stronger, cleaner bridges coming soon

As part of the Streets Ahead project, we have plans to inspect, repair and strengthen the bridges and other structures that we own across the city. This is to make sure they are safe and functional and can sustain heavy traffic without having to impose weight restrictions, which will allow traffic to flow much more easily in the future.

As part of the Streets Ahead improvements, our Streets Ahead provider, Amey, will be:

- Strengthening 44 bridges
- Repairing stone, concrete and steel bridges
- Repairing retaining walls

- Repainting steel bridges, footbridges and parapet fences
- Removing overgrown and damaging vegetation
- Preventing leaks
- Cleaning and removing rubbish, debris and graffiti

Benefits

At the end of these improvement works Sheffield's bridges and structures will be more durable, able to carry loads without restrictions improving journey routes and allowing traffic to flow more easily; and their appearance will be greatly improved keeping our city attractive.

- 620 bridges, masonry arches, footbridges, viaducts, culverts, subways and gantries
- 2,450 retaining walls that support the road and pavement

Smoother roads and pavements are coming

As part of our Streets Ahead contract we have plans to improve approximately 73% of our city's roads and pavements.

For the first time, every road and pavement in the city will be visually inspected to understand its condition by our Streets Ahead provider Amey who is developing a planned programme of improvement works.

This work is essential to bring the city's highway up to a standard, which will bring benefits beyond improving your daily journeys, it is also vital in supporting the growth and visual appearance of the city.

In the first five years

2,050 miles of pavements and 1,180 miles of roads will be improved in the first five years known as the 'core investment period' of the 25 year contract.

It is some of the most important work we'll do as part our project but it is also some of the most disruptive. We might need to close your road, or use other traffic management techniques such as temporary traffic lights or introducing single traffic, whilst we complete our improvement works.

We'll inform you by letter before we start any works in your area.

Benefits of smoother roads and pavements

There are many benefits smoother surfaces will bring to you and your community such as:

- reduced wear and tear on motor vehicles, reduce fuel consumption and reduce carbon emissions.

- 1,180 miles of roads known as the 'adopted' highway i.e. those that are maintained at public expense
- 2,050 miles of pavements
- 72,000 highway gullies

And is responsible for providing the following services:



The Streets Ahead Project

The Streets Ahead project is a huge city-wide project that will improve the condition of our city's roads, pavements, street lighting, bridges and streetscene within the first five years of a 25 year contract. These highway assets are then maintained at that improved standard for the remaining 20 years of the contract.

Introducing the Streets Ahead provider

Our Streets Ahead provider is private sector public service provider, Amey. We selected Amey to deliver our Streets Ahead project in April 2012.

Amey is now responsible for delivering the Streets Ahead works across the city on our behalf.

We'll be working together over the next 25 years to make sure that the city's highway network is fit for the future. Amey is now ultimately responsible for repairing and maintaining our city's highway network and its assets which includes:

- 1. 36,000 trees
- 2. 12,700 street nameplates
- 28,000 street signs, illuminated and non-illuminated
- 4. 68,000 streetlights
- 5. 2,050 miles of pavement

- 6. 480 traffic signals
- 7. 1,181 miles of road
- 8. 2,000 grit bins
- 9. 18,000 items of street furniture
- 10. 3 million sqm of grass verges
- 11. 2,500 litter bins
- 12. 72,000 drainage gullies
- 13. 600 bridges and other structures



Maintenance of these assets will be carried out by our Streets Ahead provider Amey for a further 20 years

Major improvements in five years (2012 – 2017)

The first five years of the Streets Ahead contract is known as the 'core investment period'. It is an intense period of time that will see 73% of our city's highway network upgraded and enhanced. It is the time when Streets Ahead will be carrying out the majority of work.

Within the first five years of the contract between 2012 and 2017, Streets Ahead will:

- Resurface 2,050 miles of pavement and 1,180 miles of road
- Upgrade more than 58,000 street lighting columns and lamps with energy efficent LED technology

- Strengthen 44 bridges
- Replace 25% of our traffic lights and signals
- Install 3,000 new highway gullies
- Install 1,000 new litter and recycling bins
- Carry out 126 drainage improvement schemes
- Replace 5,000 trees







Planning to minimise disruption

We've been working closely with our Streets Ahead provider Amey to plan an efficient and cost-effective programme to limit the impact of the Streets Ahead works on people living, working or visiting the city. Together we've devised a 'zonal approach' to carry out these works.

Our 'zonal approach'

Over the course of the five years 'core investment period' between 2012-2017, we will be upgrading the city's roads, pavements, street lighting, bridges and streetscene in a sequenced and zonal approach. The zonal approach divides the city into zones to reduce the impact of these works and keep the city moving.



There are 108 zonal schemes to be completed within the first 5 years of the 25 year contract. The zones have been divided as follows:

- A zones these represent works happening on main arterial routes across the city. There are 27 A zones across the city.
- B zones these represent works happening on local and less busy roads normally within community or residential areas. There are 81 B zones across the city.

Each zone is unique, requiring different types and levels of work. For example it could be one of more of the following:

- Tree replacement and maintenance
- Street lighting column and lamp upgrades
- Bridge and other structure repairs and improvements
- Gullies and drainage improvements
- Traffic light and signal repairs and improvements

Each zone will take approximately 15 weeks to complete, depending on the work required.

To carry out these essential works safely, we will need to use traffic management temporary traffic lights, single lane traffic, roads closures and diversions across the city. But we aim to keep this disruption to a minimum.

This work will take place using a sequenced approach with each task being undertaken by a specialist team. By concentrating the improvements needed in a short intensive period (approximately 15 weeks), Streets Ahead hope to complete all major works in one go and should not need to return in the near future.

We have planned these works to take place during off peak hours, where possible, to minimise inconvenience for the majority of residents and businesses. Temporary warning signs will be displayed in each zone confirming the start date and expected duration of the work in advance. If it is necessary to change these arrangements (for instance in the event of severe weather) the warning signs will be updated accordingly.

Call for caution and cooperation

During our improvement works we ask that you allow extra time for your journeys, particularly at peak times, and pay close attention to all traffic and advanced warning signs.

Motorists and cyclists should also be aware that there will be operatives and construction vehicles on the highway whilst work is taking place, and in the interest of keeping all road users and our workforce safe, we would appreciate your cooperation in driving safely through any roadworks.
