1. Standing Advisory Council on Religious Education (Sheffield SACRE)

1.1 The Council shall be called the Sheffield SACRE (Standing Advisory Council for Religious Education), established under Section 3.90 - 3.97 of the Education Act 1996 as amended.

2. Explanation of terms in this document

- **2.1** The "Local Authority (LA)" will mean Sheffield City Council acting either independently or through Children, Young People and Families (CYPF).
- **2.2** The "Council" will mean Sheffield's Standing Advisory Council for Religious Education (SACRE).
- **2.3** "Member" will mean a member of SACRE and includes substitute or co-opted members.
- **2.4** All questions of interpretation are governed by the "Interpretation Act" 1978 as may be subsequently amended.

3.5 Co-opted members

The Local Authority may invite co-opted members as individuals or as nominated by other organizations, where this is considered appropriate to further the work of SACRE. Currently (February 2014), members have been co-opted from the Sheffield Christian Constituency Movement, Sheffield Humanist Society and the University of Sheffield.

3.6 Other Points

- a) The Chair of the Council shall be the Executive Director of Children, Young People and Families or his/her representative. The clerk to SACRE shall be appointed by the Local Authority. A Vice Chair will be appointed from within the SACRE membership by nomination in September 2014 for a period of 3 school years (see also paragraph c) below).
- b) The core values, duties, funding, procedures and further developments for the SACRE are recorded as a separate document.
- c) All members shall be delegates who are interested in education in general, and Religious Education in particular. They shall serve for a period of 3 school years, commencing in September 2014, after which their Nominating Body may choose to re-propose them for a further 3 year period, or to propose a new member.
- d) A member who knows they will be absent can delegate a substitute to attend on their behalf. They must inform the clerk of SACRE at least 6 hours in advance of the meeting.
- e) If a member is absent for 3 or more consecutive meetings for any reason not acceptable to the council, there shall be deemed a vacated place to be filled by the Nominating Body for that committee.
- f) A meeting will only be quorate and so able to make significant decisions if the following numbers of representatives of the respective groups are present:

Committee Minimum of 2 representatives, one Christian and one non-Christian

Committees Minimum of 1 representative each **B/C/D**

g) All members are entitled to speak and vote on any issue. However, substitute or co-opted members may speak but not vote. SACRE will always seek to reach decisions on a consensus basis but when decisions are to be voted on; only one vote is allowed from each of group A, B, C and D. In the event of an equality of votes on any issue the chair may exercise a casting vote.
